# EFL Training Workshop "Teaching English to Young Learners"

This course begins by examining the role of the family, school, and community in young learners' acquisition of English in Korea. It then examines various curriculum options for organizing materials for young language learners. Finally, the course examines strategies for teaching, vocabulary, speaking, reading, and writing to young learners.

#### Course Objectives:

By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Critically assess materials designed for teaching speaking, listening, reading and writing to young learners; and
- > Design your own materials for teaching speaking, listening, reading, and writing for young learners in Korea.

#### **Design of the Course:**

As an online class, this class is structured around lessons or lectures posted on the internet in the course management system, Moodle. Each lectures describes several **reflections** that you are to complete in your journals. Also, some lessons have required **readings** that you are to respond to. Both of these components are described below.

All instructional activities will take place online and you MUST HAVE a reliable hi-speed internet Connection. The course will consist of 4 Web-based instructional modules that contain:

- Written lecture notes;

- Reflections that require you to offer your thoughts and opinions on the topic of the module;

You will be asked to communicate online with the instructor and peers asynchronously (delayed time) through E-mail and with postings made on the Forum. For details on how to complete the required reflections or tasks, please refer to the modules section in the course syllabus.

Module 8: Teaching Speaking: Songs & Holidays

#### Using songs with young learners

In Module 8, we examine how songs and the topic of holidays can be used to promote young language learners' speaking and listening skills. I point out that songs often provide a change of pace in a language lesson and increase students' motivation. In addition, songs often have repetition in them so that new vocabulary is heard over and over again. In order to provide you with ideas for various activities to use with songs, I illustrate several activities that can be used with a popular American song for young learners called Bingo. During the lecture you will hear this song as well as another well-known song called One Two Buckle My Shoe.

# Storytelling & Art Projects You also view of strip stories

You also view two short video clips that illustrate the use of strip stories and chain stories.

In examining the use of art projects in speaking/listening classes, I illustrate a project that involves drawing and describing imaginary boats and I emphasize the importance of preparing students for this project by using brainstorming and mapping. Again you view a video clip that shows how these techniques can be used in a class.

# Module 10: Teaching Reading Writing: Approaches to Teaching Writing



This module on teaching writing to young language learners describes four major approaches to the teaching of writing – controlled composition, free writing, the communicative approach and the process approach. I provide illustrations for each of these approaches and maintain that which approach to use in a class depends on the level of the students and the goals of the class.

The module also presents various arguments for using writing activities with young language learners, including the fact that writing tasks allow time for planning and revision and they result in a finished product that demonstrates students' English abilities.



Module 11 illustrates how pictures and readings can provide a stimulus for writing. I emphasize the importance of carefully designing a writing prompt so that students know exactly what they are to do in their writing. As practice, you are asked to design a writing prompt using a picture or a reading text.

This module also deals with the difficult question of how to respond to student essays. I offer several principals that you can use in responding to student essays and ask you to practice this skill by writing a response to a sample student essay.
