

Another Year of Continuing Progress

2008 was a busy year for APC with the continuation of our Master's in Intercultural Leadership Program and Luncheon Lecture Series. With the first cohort progressing through their studies online, APC stepped up its efforts for promotion of the MIL Program, course design, content delivery, and fundraising. As we move forward in 2009, APC is proud of the strides we have made thus far and looks forward to many more improvements to come.

With the technical details and course constructions in place for the first two semesters of our starting cohort, coordination of 2008's instructional design went a lot smoother. Spring marked the completion of our course development, with APC adding four new courses to the Summer and Fall semesters. The year ended with preparations for our cohort's Independent Study and Scholarly Paper. In coordination with Dr. Deane Neubauer, Emeritus Professor of Political Science at the University of Hawaii, as course adviser, guidelines were put in place for the students' culmination of the program.

Furthermore, APC has attempted many great promotional efforts through the use of emails, letters, brochures, and newspaper advertisements. In 2008, we

sent out emails to countries such as China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and Hawaii/U.S., just to name a few. Our efforts to reach a wider target audience also focused on getting information to local interests as well as students in prospective Asian-Pacific nations through letter and brochure mail outs. We placed ads with a more specific direction in the local Pacific Business News, and broaden the scope of online resources by adding our name to major search engines such as Google. APC also launched its new and more user-friendly website interface at the end of 2008. As we prepare for the next round of promotional materials, APC is considering additional forms of media such as radio and internet streaming to increase enrollment. Efforts have also been made with a few schools in Korea for the possibility of a joint program.

In addition, 2008 fundraising for donations have been through general letter mail outs to foundations, but APC continues to rely on the ongoing support of our list of Honor Roll Contributors. A recent agreement with an institution in Asia has also allowed us to fully support students' tuition fees in the next cohort. Efforts in acquiring these

necessary funds are a vital part to the attainment of our ambitious goals. APC hopes to look toward local businesses and other private organizations for future support, as well as rely on the extensive contacts of our sister institution's CAPE alumni network of friends. We wish to offer as many tuition waivers to students as possible, and therefore, what income is left may only be minimal for the reimbursement of services provided by our course developers, instructors, and staff.

2008 also saw the creation of an Academic Advisory Committee made up of outside specialists and representatives specific to Asia Pacific College's program. The sole purpose of this Academic Advisory Committee is to review and revise program objectives. Committee members are expected to provide expertise in areas such as course and curriculum content, textbooks and other teaching resources, equipment relating to course training, technological changes, and information regarding world trends.

In conclusion, APC's second year of operation has been successful. And it is with excitement that we work steadily toward the continuation of creating an available service for further education through our program.
